**Put a glass cup at the exit, under the artist statement

Step 2: Observe how people would wipe their cups with the cloth before they drink the water.

Step 3: After people have drunk it, wash the cups with dishwashing soap and sanitise them with boiling hot water.

Step 4: Put the cups back on to the round table, and let another group of audience repeat.
